



Holiday Teachable Recipe

Marshmallow Safety Snowman



Have your trusted adult read these directions while you build the Marshmallow Safety Snowman to help you remember how to UYN and stay safer online and in the real world!

You will need

1/2 of a graham cracker
2 pretzel sticks
1 small gumdrop
3 large marshmallows

Raisins or small candy pieces
Skinny licorice
White icing (small-tipped tube)

Your trusted adult!

Instructions

Help your child use the icing to attach the graham cracker, marshmallows, and other items to each other. (A pretzel “spine” will help your snowman avoid melting!)

This snowman will help us remember the rules to staying safer online. We’ll start with the graham cracker at the bottom, so the snowman can be strong. The graham cracker is like me, your trusted adult, because you can always count on me.

This first marshmallow is to remind you to always ask me before sharing your personal information.

This second marshmallow is to remind you to tell me if anyone or anything makes you scared, uncomfortable, or confused.

This third marshmallow is to remind you to tell me if anyone asks you to meet offline.

You should never meet in person with anyone you first met online.

Attach pretzel sticks as arms.

These pretzel arms will remind you to take a friend wherever you go.

Use raisins or small candy pieces for eyes and buttons. Use a piece of licorice for the mouth. As you place the mouth say...

Don’t be afraid to tell people “NO!” if they try to harm you.

Place the gumdrop “hat” on top of the marshmallow stack, using icing to secure. Then complete with licorice “scarf.”

This gumdrop is you! It’s to remind you to stay on top of following these rules. Now we’ll use this “scarf” to tie all of the rules into your memory. Can you remember what each part of the snowman represents?

Yum! Now it’s time for dessert!
